Illness or absence from the club on business is considered acceptable, but not for more than three consecutive weeks without being excused by your Board.

Attendance of Rotary clubs in every district is closely monitored and is reported in the Governors Newsletter and to Rotary International. Your contribution of attendance is very important to your club and district. You are urged to attend another club when you can't make your own meeting. Remember to return your attendance or "make-up" card to your secretary.

In closing, do your part. Do not expect others to make all the introductions. Put aside any reserve you may have with others. Make a strong effort to welcome our guests and make acquaintance your key to success.
